## Economic Thinking for speech & debate students

### An Alternative to Indoctrinate U Summer Debate Camps...

Homeschoolers are debating immigration reform and public schools are debating public health aid to Africa. Economic Thinking workshops and websites offer free-



market resources for both. The Univ. of Michigan Debate Institute provides students with forty evidence sets online on the Africa debate topic. Apparently not all socialist policies have yet been tried on Africans, and more are advocated by UM. Here is a representative card from a "Capitalism-Good" file:

*Susan George, Vice-President of ATTAC and a longstanding champion of the Third World, ... proposes a 'new, updated and Keynesian strategy . . . We need vast injections of crisis-directed resources into the global economy. They must be linked to environmental renewal, poverty eradication, and democratic governance.' She envisages this 'Planetary Contract' being administered by a new international institution and financed by such measures as the Tobin Tax and a Unitary Profits Tax on transnational corporations.*

As an alternative, Economic Thinking provides high school students and teachers an eight-page *Africa: Freedom, Prosperity & Public Health* study guide (cover page at left).

For homeschool speech and debate students we offer economic analysis of immigration and focus on problems created by the Welfare State.

*Students from Washington, California, Kansas, Texas, Michigan, Virginia, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Tennessee and Indiana have attended workshops this year.*
