



Now Seeking Applications for  
**Grassroot Institute of Hawaii Summer Internship Program**

The Grassroot Institute of Hawaii is currently seeking candidates for the Institute's summer internship program. The program provides undergraduate and graduate level students the ability to gain work experience at Hawaii's only free-market think tank. Interns will work directly with Institute staff, including the President, Director of Communications, and Director of Operations. Applicants may qualify for an internship in the areas of Policy, Development, Media, or some combination thereof.

**Policy Interns** will work with the Institute's President in order to research, author, and publish policy papers, fact sheets, commentaries, and other publications. Interns will focus on one or more policy areas such as education, taxes, government transparency, health care, or natural resources. They will engage in regular policy discussions with Institute staff members or outside policy experts. The internship will culminate with the intern presenting his/her research to an audience of staff and outside experts, as well as an exit interview with the Institute's President.

**Development Interns** will work with the Institute's Director of Operations to learn the techniques of fundraising in the competitive non-profit world. They will help plan and produce development events, mailings, and promotional materials. They will also assist in donor prospecting and membership relations activities. The internship will culminate with the intern presenting an overview of his/her work to an audience of staff and outside experts, as well as an exit interview with the Institute's President.

**Media Interns** will assist the Institute's Director of Communications in writing and editing press releases, commentaries, and other publications. They will have a central role in developing and implementing the Institute's new media initiative, with a focus on online identity growth and management. Web programming experience is helpful but not necessary. The internship will culminate with the intern presenting an overview of his/her work to an audience of staff and outside experts, as well as an exit interview with the Institute's President.

In all three internship positions, excellent, original work will be considered for publication under the intern's name, as an author or co-author.

Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to free-market principles, strong writing and communications skills, professionalism in attitude and appearance, and the initiative and willingness to undertake research, writing, and administrative projects.

Full- and part-time policy, development, and media internships will receive a stipend commensurate with skills, experience, and hours worked.
